I. Common job profile – EQF 4 Qualification: Transport & Logistics

Definition of the occupation

Take part in organising, coordinating and monitoring transport operations and related logistical services in national and international markets.

Within transport activities (all modes of transport):

- Check that the requirements of the customer are respected
- Execute and monitor/report the transport of goods (all modes of transport), according to given instructions:
 - Implement procedures
 - o Optimise operations within the context of the globalisation of trade
 - o Organise scheduled operations, ensure availability of resources and documents, follow their progress and assess their results
 - o Ensure document compliance and traceability
- Participate in customs clearance for goods. (routine tasks)
- Report any incidents to the relevant superior in order that appropriate decisions may be taken as quickly as possible
- Supervise all phases of the services in the case of an outsourcing service being used

Within logistics activities:

- Check that the requirements of the customer are respected
- Take part in organising, implementing and monitoring the logistics chain, according to given instructions
- Perform warehouse operations:
 - Carry out receiving and stocking procedures (incoming goods), order preparation and shipping procedures (outgoing goods)
 - $\circ \quad \text{Use computerised inventory management systems} \\$







- Operate handling equipment
- Participate in inventory control
- o Organise scheduled operations, ensure availability of resources and documents, follow their progress and assess their results
- Report any incidents to the relevant superior in order that appropriate decisions may be taken as quickly as possible
- Supervise all phases of the services in the case of an outsourcing service being used

For both activities:

- Take into account:
 - o The complementary modes of transport and sustainable development
 - o Imperatives of safety, quality, efficiency, environmental standards and profitability

Communication:

• Communicate with the company's various services (logistics, administrative, sales and accounting departments, as well as drivers) and external partners (clients, suppliers, subcontractors, public authorities) both orally and in writing, in their own language and in one or more other languages

Position:

- Depending on the size and type of the company, he/she will work under the supervision of a relevant manager
- After some professional experience, he/she may be potentially responsible of small teams







Technical and economic environment of employment

The profession's technical and economic environment is influenced by several factors:

- Regulatory environment
- Geographical influence
- Technological progress leading to increasing diversity and reliability of transport modes within a complex logistics chain
- New environmental constraints related to the pursuit of sustainable development
- Increased accessibility of IT solutions leading to continuous improvement of efficiency in the logistics chain

II. Common job profile – EQF 4 Qualification: Road freight driver

Definition of the occupation

Carry out road freight transport operations using Goods Vehicles (more than 3.5 tons) both within and outside the European Union (driving license B, C and CE).

Their core activity consists of executing the transport of goods, according to given instructions:

- Recognise the vehicle as the centre of the workplace of the professional driver
- Carry out a visual inspection before initiating any service
- Prepare and understand the requirements of transport missions
- Check the resources and documents conform to the requirements of the transport mission
- Prepare and organise transport missions
- Perform and/or supervise loading and unloading operations
- Drive the vehicle in a safe, responsible, environmentally friendly and reasonable way
- Carry out transport and delivery operations (including specialised transport)
- Successfully complete transport missions
- · Ensure document compliance and traceability
- Conform with regulations related to driving times
- Participate in customs clearance for goods (routine tasks)
- Operate motorised handling equipment
- Recognise the legal norms that regulate the transport activities and have the mandatory permits and licences to carry out the activity (driving licence, CAP (certificate of professional suitability) for dangerous goods or others.







Taking into account:

- o The complementary modes of transport and sustainable development
- o Imperatives of safety, quality, efficiency, environmental standards and profitability

Communication:

• Communicate with the company's various services (operations, logistics, administrative, sales departments) and external partners (clients, suppliers, subcontractors, public authorities) both orally and in writing, in their own language and in one or more other languages

Position:

• Depending on the size and type of the company, he/she will work under the supervision of a relevant manager







Technical and economic environment of employment

All of the activities concerned share two constant requirements:

Focus on health, safety and environment: the environment and people's health and safety must be protected during the whole transportation process.

Focus on quality: drivers must contribute to continuous improvement of client satisfaction in all road transport activities. To do so, drivers must act as ambassadors of their company.

The profession's technical and economic environment is influenced by several factors:

- Regulation about the necessary permits and the regulation on the obligations of the transport carrier according to the transport contract
- Health & safety rules
- Technological progress leading to increasing diversity and reliability of transport modes within a complex logistics chain

- Increased accessibility of IT solutions leading to continuous improvement of efficiency in the logistics chain

- Transport & Logistics departments of industrial or commercial companies with their own internal transport services
- Industrial vehicle rental companies







The jobs concerned

- Drivers working in companies providing any type of freight transport, including those potentially requiring specialised driving skills
- After some professional experience and only in small size companies, he/she may be potentially responsible for supervising small teams (supervising a platform team,...) or for managing a fleet
